Key Focus: Combining fabric shapes



KEY KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS

- A 3-D textile product can be made from a combination of accurately made pattern pieces, fabric shapes and different fabrics.
- Fabrics can be strengthened, stiffened and reinforced where appropriate.

RELEVANT PRIOR LEARNING / UNITS

- Y3 Know how to strengthen, stiffen and reinforce existing fabrics.
- Y3 Understand how to securely join two pieces of fabric together.
- Y3 Understand the need for patterns and seam allowances.
- Y2 Understand how simple 3-D textile products are made, using a template to create two identical shapes.
- Y2 Understand how to join fabrics using different techniques e.g. running stitch, glue, over stitch, stapling.
- Y2 Explore different finishing techniques e.g. using painting, fabric crayons, stitching, sequins, buttons and ribbons.
- Y2 and Y3 Know and use technical vocabulary relevant to the project.
